During this time, DEKAP Liberia has made significant strides in empowering the futures of children of economically disadvantaged Disabled families through our child education sponsorship program and empower thirty five (35) women and girls (Their mothers) through our inclusive savings and loan program that provide entrepreneurship as a livelihood support through our women economic empowerment program.

DEKAP Liberia has been steadfast in its Mission to lift Out of School Children whose parents are unable to provide for their schooling as a result of the marginalization and discrimination of disabled adults in Liberia.

Activities & Impact during the period under review

ACTIVITIES 1: The Child Education Sponsorship Program:

Education Highlight 2023/2024

Overview:

This program which was first initiated in 2014 has continued to support the education of children from economically disadvantaged disabled families. Over the past year, DEKAP Liberia has provided comprehensive educational support, covering tuition, fees, notebooks, and book bags for the children in its program.

During the period under review DEKAP Liberia successfully provided educational materials, including tuition fees, notebooks, and book bags, to 11 children from economically disadvantaged families through its decade partnership with Kids Educational Engagement Project (KEEP). This support has ensured that these children have the necessary resources to attend school and perform well academically.

2. Home and On-Campus Visitation:

Regular home and on-campus visits were conducted to monitor the progress of the sponsored children. These visits allowed DEKAP Liberia to assess the children's well-being, address any challenges they faced, and provide additional support when necessary.

Impact:

The sponsorship program has led to an increase in school enrollment among children from economically disadvantaged disabled families, demonstrating the positive impact of DEKAP Liberia's efforts.

These accomplishments underscore the importance of our educational support initiatives, and we are delighted to witness the continued academic progress of these children.



Elijah's story began when he joined Dekap Liberia Child Education Sponsorship Program as a fifth grader.

Early Life and Challenges

Born to Florence Ben who is also a visually disabled woman, Elijah lost his father when he was just at tender age, leaving Florence to single-handedly raise him and his brother.

Florence, a beneficiary of the DEKAP Inclusive Women Savings and Loan Program, makes plantain chips and peanuts for sale in her community to provide for her family. Her determination to succeed and support her children is a testament to her strength and entrepreneurial spirit.

Despite the odds, Elijah's educational journey has been remarkable.

With support from DEKAP through its partner, KEEP Liberia Elijah and other underprivileged children are helped with tuition and fees, notebooks and bags including regular visitations which has paved the way for their academic achievements. This support has been extended to 11 children, including Elijah, ensuring they have the opportunity to pursue their education.

Recently promoted to the eleventh grade at the prestigious Lot Carey Mission School, Elijah continues to excel academically. His quiet demeanor and astute nature have earned him the trust and respect of his peers and teachers alike. He speaks well and possesses innate leadership abilities, qualities that have shone brightly throughout his educational journey. **Passion for Music**

Elijah's talents extend beyond academics. He has a deep passion for music and is an active member of the choir at the School of the Blind.

Not only does he sing beautifully, but he also leads the choir.

A Glimmer of Hope

Through the compassionate intervention of Samaritan's Purse, Elijah underwent a medical procedure that brought a glimmer of hope into his life. One of his eyes was treated, enabling him to perceive a little light. This medical advancement, though small, has had a significant impact on Elijah's outlook on life, further motivating him to strive for excellence.



The Ebola epidemic was a devastating period for many families, and Helena was no exception. She tragically lost both of her parents, becoming an orphan and survivor at a young age. As a result of her situation, her future seemed uncertain, but hope came through the partnership between DEKAP her partner, KEEP.

This partnership enabled Helena to become a beneficiary of the Out-of-School Child Education Sponsorship Program, providing her with the educational support and mentorship she desperately needed Living with her only surviving sister, Helena managed to continue her education despite the emotional and financial hardships. However, tragedy struck again a few months

ago when her sister died during childbirth, leaving Helena more vulnerable than ever. With no stable home and the burden of grief weighing heavily on her, Helena's schooling has been severely impacted.

As we approach another academic year, Helena's situation as a girl child, highlights the urgent need for support and intervention. Despite the adversity she faces as a child, Helena's determination to pursue her education remains unwavering.

Helena's story is a testament to the vital role that programs like DEKAP's Out-of-School Child Education Sponsorship play in transforming lives.

Through the continued support and partnership with KEEP Liberia, we hope to provide Helena with the stability and resources she needs to continue her education and achieve her dreams.

Her journey underscores the importance of DEKAP Liberia program to the underprivileged and the urgent need for partnership support considering the impact it can have on the lives of vulnerable children.

ACTIVITIES 2: Disabled Women Inclusive Savings and Loan Program

Highlight On Disabled women Entrepreneurship

Overview:

The Disabled Women Inclusive Savings and Loan Program has empowered 35 disabled women (their mothers) through entrepreneurship training and financial support. This program aims to enhance the

economic independence and self-reliance of disabled women in Liberia through a dignified manner instead of engaging in begging arms on the streets.





Key Activities:

1. Entrepreneurship Training:

DEKAP Liberia conducted multiple training sessions focused on entrepreneurship, financial literacy, and business management. These sessions equipped the participants with the skills needed to start and grow their businesses.

2. Savings and Loan Support:

The program provided financial support through a savings and loan scheme, enabling the women to access capital for their businesses. This support has been instrumental in helping them establish and expand their businesses. This initiative was supported through the support of UN Women Liberia from 2019 to present

Impact:

1. Business Growth:

During the period, 70% of the participants have reported significant growth in their businesses and increase in income.

2. Economic Empowerment:

The program has contributed to the economic empowerment of disabled women, allowing them to achieve dignified livelihood.

This program has also boost the capacity of disabled indicating that "Disability is not Inability"

ACTIVITIES 3:

Healthy Relationship Talk on Social Media

Overview:

DEKAP Liberia has taken a proactive approach to promoting healthy and non-abusive relationships through social media campaigns and conversation. This targets intimate partners, encouraging them to maintain respectful and supportive relationships.

Key Activities:

1. Social Media Campaigns and Conversations:

Regular posts and live discussions were conducted on social media platforms to raise awareness about the importance of healthy relationships and the dangers of abusive behavior.

2. Engagement with Audience:

The campaigns encouraged active participation from the audience, with many individuals sharing their experiences and seeking advice on maintaining healthy relationships.

Impact:

1. Increased Awareness:

The social media conversation have reached many people, significantly increasing awareness about the importance of non-abusive relationships among intimate partners.

2. Behavioral Change:

Testimonials from participants indicate that the campaigns have led to positive changes in their relationships, with many reporting improved communication and reduced conflict.
